Then every 9th grader in our District would know something about Rotary and our 4-Way Test. Think of the positive effect this would have on their lives, Interact Clubs, the public image of Rotary, and the future of Rotary. #### **RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ROTARY CLUB**

- 1. Agree to sponsor the contest.
- 2. Identify and contact the lead English teacher for ninth grade classes.
- 3. Review the contest rules on the District website: www.rotarydistrict7640.org.
- 4. Appoint a committee to evaluate the best essays submitted by the teachers from each school.
- 5. Select the Club winner(s) and submit the first place essay(s) to the District office by March 25, 2018.
- 6. Recognize the Club winners, parents and teacher(s), and award certificates/prizes.

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ROTARY DISTRICT**

- 1. Display rules for the contest on the District website.
- 2. Provide cash awards for the District winners.
- 3. Appoint a committee to evaluate the winning essays submitted by the Clubs and select the District winners.

4. Invite the winners, their parents, and teachers to the District Conference where prizes will be awarded to the top three students and the winner will present the winning essay.

5. Display the winning essays on the District website.

## **Checklist and Specifics Concerning the Contest**

□ Original and personal work of the student. (9th grade students only, signed pledge required, page 9)

□ No more than 1500 words, double spaced. (Specific administrative instructions attached, page 6)

 $\Box$  Written in Microsoft Word format.

 $\Box$  No graphics or highlighted text.

 $\Box$  Must be available to be published in the press.

□ Must be approved by the student's parents. (page 9)

□ Critical dates established and followed by all concerned for the conduct of the contest. (page 5)

 $\Box$  Initial screening of nominated essays is performed by the local school English department faculty. The most competitive essays (6-12) are then given to the sponsoring Rotary Club for final evaluation.

□ A committee of the sponsoring Rotary Club evaluates the essays in accordance with an established Evaluation Guide. (page 7)

□ Finalists, parents, and teachers are recognized at a sponsoring Rotary Club function and awards presented.

 $\Box$  Press release, with photo(s), submitted to local press. (sample, page 10)

□ The winning essay from each Club is forwarded to the District Office by March 26, 2018

#### Recommendations

• A District-wide Four-Way Test Essay contest will continue in the 2017-2018 Rotary year.

• The winning Essays from all participating District Clubs must be in the District Office by March 26, 2018 to allow sufficient time for District judging, notifying the winners, and listing their names in the 2018 District Conference program booklet.

• Monetary awards: First Place - \$500, Second Place - \$300, Third Place - \$100

## 2017-2018 Rotary Four-Way Test Essay Contest Criteria

## **Topic of the essay:**

Rotary's "Four-Way Test" and what it means to the conduct of my daily life.

## The Four-Way Test:

- Of the things we think, say and do,
- 1. Is it TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOOD WILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

#### **Purpose of the essay:**

A written essay that explains the student's personal understanding of the "Four-Way Test", and how it relates to his/her life experiences and/or society. How does it influence what we think, say and do?

# 2017-2018 Rotary Four-Way Test Time Line

Fall 2017	Enlist the English Department or head English teacher of the local ninth grade classes.
February 2018	Essays to be turned in to teachers.
March 3, 2018	Teachers screen and evaluate essays. Competitive essays are submitted to the Sponsoring Rotary Club.
March 5 - 17, 2018	Sponsoring Rotary Club committee selects winning essays.
March 23, 2018	The last date for essays are to be submitted to District Office via e-mail at <u>SJRotary.Districtoffice@verizon.net</u> .
April 11, 2018	District Four-Way Test Committee announces District winners.

## Administrative Instructions Rotary Four-Way Test Essay Contest

\_ High School ninth

**Eligibility:** \_\_\_\_\_ grade English students.

**Format:** Microsoft Word format will be used. The essay must be prepared for printing on white paper, size 8.5 X 11.0. The font will be Century Schoolbook, Arial, or Times New Roman. Font size will be 12 point. Do not insert identifying information on any sheet except the cover sheet. Lines will be double spaced. Do not insert graphics. The use of bold, italics, and/or underlining should be avoided.

**Number of Copies:** Two printed copies of the essay or a digital copy (with cover sheet) must be delivered/sent to the Rotary District 7640 Office or sent to <u>SJRotary.Districtoffice@verizon.net</u>.

**Essay Length:** The essay must not exceed 1500 words in length.

**Cover Sheet:** A cover sheet must be attached to each essay. See the attached format for the Cover Sheet.

**Original Work:** The essay must be the original work of the student submitting the essay for competition. Team writing and the use of work written by other sources, even if foot-noted, is not authorized. Participating students will sign the pledge on the Cover Sheet stating that the essay is their original work.
